Guest Speaker: Stephen Dowling was introduced by PP Paul Kearney.

- Dowling McCarthy Tyres (DMcC) has been going for 44 years, after "Tiger" Dowling and "Putt" McCarthy put their heads together. Back then, there were several other tyre outlets in our area, such as Brown's Vulcanising; Goodyear Tyres, etc. "We started in Cooee and we are still there. We are fortunate to have very loyal employees, who have sometimes continued without pay in tough times."
- DMcC set up businesses in Hobart (1997), Launceston (2003) and at one time had an office in Melbourne Port as well; all up, we had 60 employees. Now we have seven outlets and 40 employees. Truck tyres and re-treads are the main driver of our business (That's not surprising when a milk tanker can travel well over 1,000 km each day!)

- At one time, there were six tyre manufacturers in Australia, all reliant on high tariff protection. When Federal Labor cut protection, this changed drastically. Now?
 None! All our tyres come from China. Worldwide, there are only four manufacturers: Michelin (Clermont-Ferrand, France), Bridgestone (Kurume, Japan), Goodyear (Akron USA), Continental (Hanover, Germany) in that order. Getting tyres into Australia is not cheap; prices of containers skyrocketed recently.
- Stephen said that the third Dowling generation is now involved in the business. The firm has consistently made donations to sporting clubs tens of thousands of dollars annually.
