Past President Allan:

In his capacity as provider of news on Rotary Foundation and Rotary International, Allan presented this short talk:

Have you met a victim of human trafficking here in Burnie?

Potentially, there could be 100 people in Burnie who are victims of forced labour, sexual exploitation, domestic servitude or forced marriage. Today, there are over 40 million people enslaved in 155 countries; 25 percent of these are under 18 years of age. Human slavery is the fastest growing criminal enterprise worldwide – so why would Burnie miss out?

The ILO (the International Labour Organisation) – believes around AUD \$7,000 is made from forced labour **every second**. Would we want to miss out on this?

I am not joking! Human trafficking is not a joke; it is huge and must not be ignored.

Recently, an anti-trafficking organisation in Seattle, USA, placed a fake advertisement in a community newspaper stating that a 15-year-old girl was for sale for sex. Within two hours, the organisation received 250 enquiries, mostly from businesses in downtown Seattle.

The *Rotary Action Group Against Slavery* was formed in 2013; it has members now in over 65 countries. In February this year, the RI Board of Directors approved an anti-human trafficking resolution encouraging Rotary clubs around the world to engage in projects to protect all victims of hunger, neglect, abuse, and all forms of exploitation and modern-day slavery.

The *Action Group Against Slavery* has a Co-ordinator in Australia; Tony Stokes, who is in the Box Hill Central Rotary Club.
