George explained that he has initiated a series of talks by our members such that they can tell other members about their life in and out of Rotary. Ian is the first to tell us about his life.

I was born in Burnie at the old Darwin Hospital in Alexander Street in 1953, so I am now 70 years old; the *end is nigh!* My father was a Real Estate Agent. I attended Burnie Primary School when this was located where the Target Store is

now. I grew up in Ocean Vista. When I turned 12, I was enrolled in Friends School in Hobart. This is a Quaker School and it was the only co-educational school in Tasmania at that time. From 1966 onwards, I experienced life in a big city – Hobart! I went to Tas. Uni. and studied Law. Throughout my time in Hobart, I was quite active in a range of sports, chiefly Aussie Rules and rowing.

I gained some experience in law by working at the Burnie law firm of Chaos, Can't Win and Muddle Through – also known as Kay and Ruddle – and for some other law firms in Burnie. Then, in 1992, I opened my own law practice.

I became very active in the Burnie Surf Club and still am fairly active, though my rowing days are behind me.

I was a member of Burnie Apex Club in the 1980's. When I turned 40 years of age, I joined East Burnie Rotary Club. In year 2000, I joined Burnie Rotary Club.
