- David has spoken with Yvette Radford, who has been in contact with a member from MRA about being involved with a hotrod car show.

Acting Secretary, Leanne Cullen:

- TasNetworks currently have grants available. Members are requested to consider offering to assist with grant writing.
- The Rotary Down Under (RDU) website is advertising new merchandise. Members requiring polo tops, windcheaters, jackets and caps are advised to visit the website for merchandise.

Wayne Licht:

- advised the meeting of a worthy project for consideration. *Tassie Mums* is a group supporting new Mums, arranges care packs and provides support to victims of domestic violence.
- Wayne also provided an update of the project to construct a BBQ Shelter near the Yacht Club at South Burnie. This is now a joint project between Burnie and Burnie West Clubs. Somerset Rotary Club have withdrawn from the project, choosing not to be involved any further and have returned all proceeds from the Nestle Milo sales.
- Wayne has further meetings with Council and Yacht Club representatives in the near future. All members are reminded that they will be required to assist with construction of the shelter when arrangements have been finalised.

Treasurer, Paul Kearney:

- Subscriptions are now due for any members that have still not paid.
